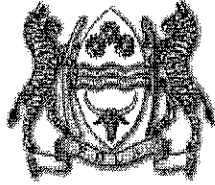

**UPDATED LIST OF YELLOW FEVER DECLARED COUNTRIES**

This correspondence serves to notify you of the updated list of the yellow fever declared countries worldwide. **This letter supersedes our earlier letter dated 18<sup>th</sup> May 2016** in which **Tanzania** and **Zambia** were erroneously included in the list of the declared countries. The fact of the matter is Tanzania and Zambia are no longer among yellow fever declared countries.

With the above clarification we would like to assure you that travellers from the above mentioned two countries no longer require proof of vaccination against yellow fever to be allowed entry into Botswana.

I therefore highly regret for any inconvenience caused and we look forward to continue working closely with you.
